FROM the PASTOR

Dear Trinity Family,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! For this month's edition of the Trumpet, I would like to highlight the wonderful blessing that God has given to the Lutheran Church in Springfield by allowing us to open a new Lutheran high school here in less than two weeks. As many of you are aware, this high school project has been in the works for over a year and a half, and very soon, we will see the fruits of our labors. Wednesday, August 13 will be the first day of school at Springfield Lutheran High School, and it will begin with a celebratory opening service in Trinity's sanctuary at 8:30 AM. Everyone from the community is invited to this service, including all Trinity members. Our guest preacher will be Rev. Dr. Michael Zeigler, the Speaker of the Lutheran Hour and former member of Trinity. Following the service, there will be a formal opening of the education building for the school, a reception in the gym, and a tour of the campus, after which the students and teachers will begin their inaugural school year. It will be a great celebration for our congregation and our community, and I hope that you will join us if you can!

Of course, starting a school can only happen through the hard work and dedication of many different people, some of whom I'd like to highlight in this article. First of all, Stephanie Grandestaff, the Executive Director of SLHS (and an alumna of SLS) has put in countless hours planning, organizing, communicating, and doing all kinds of other things of which I'm probably not even aware. Her work in handling the business side of things has been indispensable to making sure the school can launch this year.

I'd also like to acknowledge Tim Zeigler, the school's inaugural principal, and a member of Trinity whom most of you know well. He brings a wealth of experience as a certified Lutheran teacher and former public school principal to this project, and his expertise has helped us to ensure that the academic, social, and spiritual aspects of the school are where they need to be. We are so thankful that he was willing to take on this responsibility, and we are excited to see how things progress under his watch.

SLHS's Board of Directors has also had a lot of work to do in getting the school launched, with many meetings that have gone multiple hours into the evening. This group of volunteers has been highly dedicated and supportive of the entire venture, and we could not have done it without them. I myself serve as the Board's pastoral advisor, and the voting members of the Board consist of Danielle Nagel (President), Pastor Dave Benson (Vice-President), Brock Buerck (Secretary), John Yoo (Treasurer), Pastor Jarod Koenig, Ken Sprenger, and Brenda Owen. Former members who also made many contributions include Nicole Carr (President) and Amy Schafer (Treasurer). I am so thankful to all of these individuals for their hard work in making the school's launch a success.

I would also like to thank the members of Trinity for their willingness to host the school on our campus. You have all been quite generous and accommodating with our facilities and equipment, and starting the first school year this fall would not have been possible without Trinity's involvement. I know that the leadership of SLHS is committed to respecting Trinity's facilities and making sure that the school's presence does not disrupt Trinity's activities or ministries. This is a wonderful opportunity that we have as a congregation to support Lutheran education in Springfield, and it gives me great joy that we have so enthusiastically embraced it.

As far as I am aware, this high school project is the third attempt to bring a Lutheran high school to Springfield. The previous two attempts failed for various reasons, but it has remained a dream for many Lutherans in this area to start a high school here, despite the setbacks. I am so delighted that this third attempt has proven successful, and that we are poised to begin a historic inaugural school year in just a few weeks. God has truly blessed this school project, and has blessed the Lutheran Church in Springfield with it as well. I ask that you would all join me in praying for the continued success of the school, so that it might grow and expand, become financially stable, and eventually obtain its own facilities. I also ask that you would pray with me that the Gospel of Jesus Christ would be taught in all of its truth and purity at SLHS, and that the school would never forget that its mission is primarily to proclaim that Gospel and God's Word in all of its fulness. May God bless Trinity Lutheran Church and SLHS with harmony, cooperation, and a shared purpose and mission as we begin this new school year together!

Adult Bible Class Descriptions

Luke – In the Book of Luke, Jesus teaches us about how to live our life. Through parables, he teaches us how to treat one another and live in the world with kindness and humility. In Luke, we also learn about what Jesus holds in high regard. That he has love for the afflicted and the sinners. This class is led by Dr. Bob Quebbeman.

Ruth, 1 Samuel & 2 Samuel – We will pick back up this study: *The Stuff They didn't Teach Me In Sunday School...About the Exodus!* LHM Executive Director Bruce Wurdeman takes the viewer on a whirlwind tour of this formative period in Israel's development. With an eye to detail, he notes the rise of Moses, Israel's bondage under Pharaoh, the havoc God wreaked through the ten plagues, Israel's exit to the Sinai, and its 40-year romp in the wilderness with Moses at the helm. This series ends with Moses, the mighty Levite, a prophet without rival "whom the LORD knew face to face" (Deuteronomy 34:10b), being laid to rest in Moab. The torch has now passed to Joshua. This class is facilitated by Zeke Young.

High School Bible Study-Josh Sexton teaches our High School Students (9th-12th grade).

Born of Woman – Led by Dakotah Gumm, this bible study for the women of the congregation will explore the genealogy of Christ, and will meet June 2- August 11at 9:30 a.m. (with the exception of July 7 & Aug 4).

Bible Reading Journey - Continue your journey through the Bible in two years. Based on the reading plan in the Lutheran Study Bible from CPH, use handouts written by Rev. Dr. Todd Biermann to guide your study and home discussions. The class times will be changing with the end of midweek. Continue to follow the reading plan on your own, and join the group for Bible Study and deeper discussion on Sundays.

Luther's Catechism -- This class will offer an in-depth look at Luther's Catechisms on Wednesday nights. We'll learn more about the main teachings of Christian doctrine (the 10 Commandments, Creed, Lord's Prayer, and more) and discuss how to use and apply these doctrines at home in worship and devotion and in conversations throughout your daily life. This class will be especially helpful for the parents of our 3rd-8th graders as you learn more about the Catechism together. The Small Catechism was designed for individual use by pastors and laypersons alike or for use in homes for the instruction of children, while the Large Catechism was intended to assist church workers in their task of teaching the chief parts of Christian doctrine.

As always, this discipleship class will provide valuable resources, practical tools, and support from other Trinity adults as you learn more about the core of our faith! All adults at Trinity are invited to this Wednesday night class from 6:30-7:30 (6:00-6:45 during Advent and Lent) in the Heilman room. 
Adult Midweek Class



Stewardship Moment

Jesus' transforming presence

"But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.' Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:8-10 NIV).

Who knew, all those kids sitting in Sunday school were getting a lesson in stewardship! Generations of children have very often heard lessons based on the familiar account of Zacchaeus. The diminutive tax collector's curiosity surrounding the person and ministry of Jesus is what the Holy Spirit used to set him on a collision course for a total stewardship transformation. This transformation, according to the text of Luke 19, is not just about this life. This stewardship transformation is about eternity as well!



Remember the story: Zacchaeus was a tax collector. Do not think of friendly neighborhood IRS agents. This was more like a toll booth operator, but the governing authorities did not set the toll. They would contract men to staff roadside booths and tax the commerce that was passing along the road. This was an enterprise full of greed and graft. The tax collectors would take as much as they could and only pass on a portion to the government. The rest did not go into the community chest either! It went into the pocket of the tax collector.

This is why the people had such disdain for Jewish tax collectors. They were seen as both crooks and traitors. They were crooks in that they extorted their compatriots and others in the toll process. But worse, they were seen as traitors because their efforts supported the occupying Roman authorities. That is the real reason that the people would not make way so that short Zacchaeus could see Jesus.

For this reason, he runs ahead and climbs a tree. He had heard all the stories. He wanted to see this Jesus with his own eyes. Mercy is on display. This hated crook and traitor gets a direct audience with Jesus — at Jesus' own request! Jesus invites Himself to Zacchaeus' house. This is where the transformation is about to take place!

Notice how Jesus does it. He does not preach a three-week sermon series, nor does He ask Zacchaeus to make a pledge. There is nothing programmatic about Jesus' approach. But Zacchaeus is completely transformed! The transforming force is the very presence of Jesus!

Direct time with Jesus takes a crooked, selfish, criminal and makes him the most faithful steward. This new life of stewardship is marked by the promises made. First, he gives half of his ill-gotten gains to the poor. These are people whom he would not have defrauded at all! Yet, after spending time with Jesus, they are His first concern. Only after this does he double the requirement of the Levitical law on fraud. And what does Jesus say is the result? Salvation!

Doing the acts of stewardship does not save. Rather, the faith in Jesus that is created by the Holy Spirit is what saves! This is critical for us to confess. Failed stewardship can and will cut you off from God. The only antidote for failed stewardship is the presence of Jesus.

We do not need to run ahead and climb a tree for this presence of Jesus. He makes Himself available to us every week in the Divine Service. He speaks His Word of invitation to us in the pages of Holy Scripture. This, and this alone, transforms us from sinner to saint, from owner to steward of all that belongs to the Lord.

Do you want to become a more faithful steward? Spend more time with Jesus. Make the Divine Service a weekly priority. Feast on Christ's body and blood weekly! This is the great gift that brings salvation from God's House to yours!
